**Content:**

- Using atlases and globes to identify the countries of North and South America.
- Use atlases and digital/computer mapping to locate capital cities of the Americas.
- Using a globe and world maps, the children will recognise longitude and latitude and use co-ordinates to locate specific places on a world map.
- Using atlases, and geographical terminology the children will describe the location and characteristics of a range of places across the Americas, including the climates and biomes across the Americas.
- Using internet access independently, the children will name and locate the ancient and new wonders of the world.
- Using internet access independently, the children will describe the characteristics and significance of a natural wonder of the Americas.
