## Reminders....

- \* **COATS!!!** No child should be coming into school without a coat. Even if they travel to school in a warm car, they will be outside during the day and will need to be wrapped up.
- \* With the dark mornings and evenings, please be even more careful when parking near the school. Please also be considerate of local residents too, as we have had complaints about access to driveways being blocked.
- \* Please label all hats, scarves and gloves that the children wear to school.
- \* All children are required to wear black school shoes, and not trainers. If your child is not wearing the correct footwear, please inform us of the reason why.
- \* Every child should bring a water bottle to school each day. This bottle should be plastic and of a suitable size for the class carriers. Bottles should contain plain water only.

# Community Information

We're encouraging all parents to **Think Pharmacy First**

Did you know that community pharmacies can now offer clinical appointments with medication available (if required) for five clinical conditions particularly relevant to school age children?

- Ear ache (children aged 1-17)
- Sore throat (over 5s)
- Infected insect bites (over 1s)
- Impetigo (over 1s)
- Sinusitis (over 12s)

GP practices are busy and making an appointment with them is not always necessary!

When your child is ill with any of these conditions, head straight to your local community pharmacy where you can have a consultation with a trained clinical professional and receive advice, guidance and even medication if it's needed. Let's get your child on the road to recovery as soon as possible.

**Earache (Children aged 1 to 17 years)**

**Infected Insect Bite or Impetigo (Children and adults age 1 and over)**

**Sore throat (Children and adults age 5 and up)**

The majority of Frimley Health and Care community pharmacies offer the Pharmacy First service.

Remember - if your child has an ear ache, sore throat, impetigo symptoms or a suspected infected insect bite think Pharmacy First.

## School Meals

The lunch choices for week commencing Monday 13<sup>th</sup> January 2025 are Week 3 of the Winter Menu, but there have been some changes. If you order in advance, online, the options will be the generic Week 3 choices, but the meals that will be served are shared below. Plain pasta is available on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and jacket potatoes are served on Tuesday and Thursday. Both come with a selection of toppings.

School Meals cost £2.69 per day, and we ask that accounts are kept in credit. There is a reminder function that can be set up on the Scopay system, which will alert you if your child's balance falls below an amount set by you. With the weather so cold at the moment, why not encourage your child to have a hot meal at lunchtime?
