pictures. Do we think it is Africa or UK? Address misconceptions. Look at the globe and find the continent of Africa. Using atlases the children locate Africa using a map and locate some of its countries (in pairs). What countries have they heard of?

- **Identifying Kenya and its features.**

Lesson 2- locate Kenya- Revise some of Africa's countries. Focus on Kenya. Use Google Earth and explore Kenya. Move onto the ppt and share some of Kenya's famous landmarks. Discuss what it is like. The children are going to create a fact file about Kenya. How is Kenya different to Wraysbury? How is it similar?

- **Looking at African animals**

Lesson 3- African animals- Watch the opening of the Lion King. What animals can the children see? Recap Science- how are those animals adapted to living there? What conditions do the animals need. Watch the video about African animals and discuss facts. Choose an African animal and find out about it. How are Animals in Africa different to Animals we find in England/Wraysbury?

- **Looking at the Masai Tribe**

Lesson 4- Looking at the Masai tribe (Masai and I book)- compare and contrast our lives to the Masai tribe. Splitting A3 paper in half, compare and contrast what life is like.
