We would like to take a moment to thank you for your valuable contributions in our recent Parent Participation Session and for completing the PINS Survey. These allowed us to gather feedback directly from you, which we have shared anonymously with the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) to inform school practices. Your feedback is invaluable in helping us improve the services and support for all students, particularly children who are neurodivergent.

Feedback

In response to your feedback, we have had a constructive conversation with the Senior Leadership Team (SLT) and have agreed on several action points:

- 1. Improve communication with parents regarding SEND processes to ensure clarity and understanding.
- 2. Introduce "Blowing Your Own Trumpet" clubs specifically designed for neurodivergent children to celebrate their strengths and achievements.
- 3. Organize neurodivergent-focused coffee mornings to provide support and build community among parents.
- 4. Conduct phone calls to parents to check that children have settled well and address any concerns early.

Unfortunately, it was not possible to implement all suggestions from the parent sessions due to a variety of reasons, such as financial constraints. If you would like any specific feedback on specific points, please contact us using the details at the end of this letter.

PINS Support Being Undertaken by Wraysbury Primary School

As part of the PINS program, every school can access a menu of support, including training, coaching, workshops, and sensory audits, to help foster a more inclusive environment for all learners. Each school can select what works for them depending on their capacity.
