Geography Intent:

The children will be able to discuss the similarities and differences between all four seasons and their weather patterns. Using Atlases, photographs, technology and videos the children will be able to use basic geographical vocabulary to discuss the main similarities and differences between Windsor and a seaside town.

vocabulary to refer to:

- key physical features, including: beach, cliff, coast, forest, hill, mountain, sea, ocean, river, soil, valley, vegetation, season and weather
- key human features, including: city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office, port, harbour and shop

- use simple compass directions (North, South, East and West) and locational and directional language [for example, near and far; left and right], to describe the location of features and routes on a map
- use aerial photographs and plan perspectives to recognise landmarks and basic human and physical features; devise a simple map; and use and construct basic symbols in a key
- use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of their school and its grounds and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment.



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Content:

**Introduction to geographical vocabulary and weather patterns associated with Summer**

- School trip to Ruslip Lido. Experience being at the seaside.
- Look at Summer, weather, daylight hours, holidays. Children will learn about other countries not following English weather patterns.

**Name and locate the four countries of the United Kingdom**

- Use atlases to locate the UK, label the four countries. Identify the four countries and label the coastline.
- The children will look at compass directions, using a compass. They will make a map of the school grounds showing North, South, East and West.

**Recognise similarities and differences in the human and physical features of two areas in the United Kingdom**

- What is a coast? – Colour the coastline
- Look at a coastal town Worthing –The children will use google earth, videos and photographs to find the similarities and differences with Windsor and Worthing.
- The children will produce a labelled drawing of a typical seaside
