
#### Reminders.....

- \* Please remove multiple keyrings from children's book bags. The bags are becoming difficult to store, and issues are being caused in class when children swap or give away their charms.



#### School Meals

The lunch choices for week commencing Monday  $31^{st}$  March 2025 are Week 1 of the Winter Menu. To celebrate Easter, there will be a slight change to next Friday's choices. The main option will still be fishfingers and chips, but the vegetarian option will be a Vegan Sausage Roll and the children will have a chocolate crispy nest for pudding! Plain pasta is available on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, and jacket potatoes are served on Tuesday and Thursday. Both come with a selection of toppings.

From 1st April 2025, School Meals will cost £2.79 per day, and we ask that accounts are kept in credit. There is a reminder function that can be set up on the Scopay system, which will alert you if your child's balance falls below an amount set by you. The new menu, that starts after the Easter break, was sent out this week and is also available on the website. If you are able to make choices in advance (up to the night before), it saves the children time during registration, and you can also encourage your child to try something new!
